The story writing activity should be conducted again in the future. The activity is a valuable learning experience for students, and it helps them to develop their creativity, imagination, and writing skills.





Selected artworks were displayed in a mini-exhibition at [Insert Location], allowing participants to showcase their creativity and share their work with others.




Class 3 to 5 – Spell Bee

The objectives of the activity was to improve students' vocabulary and language comprehension. To encourage collaborative learning and teamwork. To make learning new words enjoyable and memorable.




Class 9 to 10 – Nukkad Natak on Cyber security




Class 9 to 10 – Poster making on Independence Day




















Class 6 to 8 – National History Bee (Quiz)



At the end of the competition, the top three students were awarded certificates. Special recognition was given to students who exhibited outstanding knowledge and quick recall.






Class 6 to 8- Hindi Dohe Recitation
